The ICHW works with the Sunshine Coast Hospital and Health; Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Child and Family Health Program, to help you and your children access the services and support you need.

HOW THE NCACCH INDIGENOUS CHILD HEALTH WORKER (ICHW) CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD OR CHILDREN:

- Provide access and support to services such as Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy and Parenting programs
- Provide access and support to Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) Specialist services
- Provide referral pathway to Paediatric services
- Provide health information and health advocacy for children and their families
- Work with your school to provide programs for parents and children
- Provide access to Child Health Clinics, including Ear Health Screening, basic health assessments and Midwife services
