### NCACCH Update #6 on Coronavirus (COVID-19)

As of 9<sup>th</sup> June 2021, Queensland Health confirmed a Covid-19 positive case in the Caloundra region of the Sunshine Coast with contact tracing and testing underway.

A Public Health Alert has been issued for parts of the Sunshine Coast, Goondiwindi, and Toowoomba in relation to this case.
