Martie Eaton will be Project Managing our AMS establishment and is a long-term Sunshine Coast local who holds a Bachelor's degree in Social Science and has over 30 years of experience in the healthcare sector.

Since 2012. Martie has been fortunate to work with the Institute for Urban Indigenous Health (IUIH), where she has contributed to improving service delivery within the Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Service (ACCHS) space, initially with Moreton ATSICHS as their inaugural Health Services Manager. Throughout her time at IUIH, Martie has worked on a range of projects, including supporting the establishment of six Primary Health Care (PHC) clinics and leading the development of four GP Respiratory Clinics (GPRCs) across South East Queensland during the COVID-19 pandemic. She has also been part of developing and implementing the IUIH System of Care (ISoC) and ISoC2 "pod model," which have helped strengthen service delivery.

Over the last ten years, Martie has been honoured with requests to share her service development experience with Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations (ACCHOs) across the country, an opportunity she deeply values. Her focus remains on collaboration, learning and supporting meaningful improvements in health service provision with a passion for removing barriers to access for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

The NCACCH Journey

For over 20 years, NCACCH has been proud to run a unique Brokerage model—a way of delivering services that focuses on client choice, keeping costs low, and putting our mob first. We were the only Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation (ACCHO) in the country operating this way. But as our community grew, health services became harder to access, and the funding stayed much the same, it became clear we needed to change to keep meeting everyone's needs.

Listening to what our mob told us was important, the NCACCH Board made the big decision to add new ways of delivering services. We shifted to a mix of the Brokerage model and an Aboriginal Medical Service (AMS) model, helping us grow, meet demand, and stay strong for the future.

This change has been a huge success.

We opened our first AMS in Gympie in 2022, followed by our first Community Hub in 2023. Then came a second AMS in Maroochydore and, in 2025, our first mobile health clinic (MobPod) for Gympie and nearby towns. Our Board and staff are so proud to take this journey with our community, and we look forward to continuing to provide safe, culturally strong care for our mob now and into the future.

NCACCH is funded by the Australian Government's Department of Health (DoH), through the Grant Services Branch (GSB) as an Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Service, In 2011 NCACCH became an ISO 9001:2008 Quality Management Systems Accredited Organisation.


